


### Marking descriptors

- → Task Fulfilment
- Cohesion and Coherence
- Grammar and Lexis
- → Task fulfilment is worth 40%, the others are worth 30% each.





- -> a matching score of less than 10% but there was plagiarism





Look at the parts of your text that are highlighted in the report (NOT just the similarity index).


Try to PARAPHRASE them better or rewrite the whole section in your own words.


- → 'in that X' (where X is a clause)

- → 'with regard to X' (where X is a noun)
- 'with respect to X' (where X is a noun)
- → 'in terms of X' (where X is a noun)



#### For example, citizen journalism is better than traditional journalism in terms of


- → ... the speed with which news can be uploaded to the internet
- → ... its focus on local news
- → ... accessibility
- ... the degree of inclusivity that it allows
- -> ... who decides what news is considered to be important
- ... developing a sense of community
