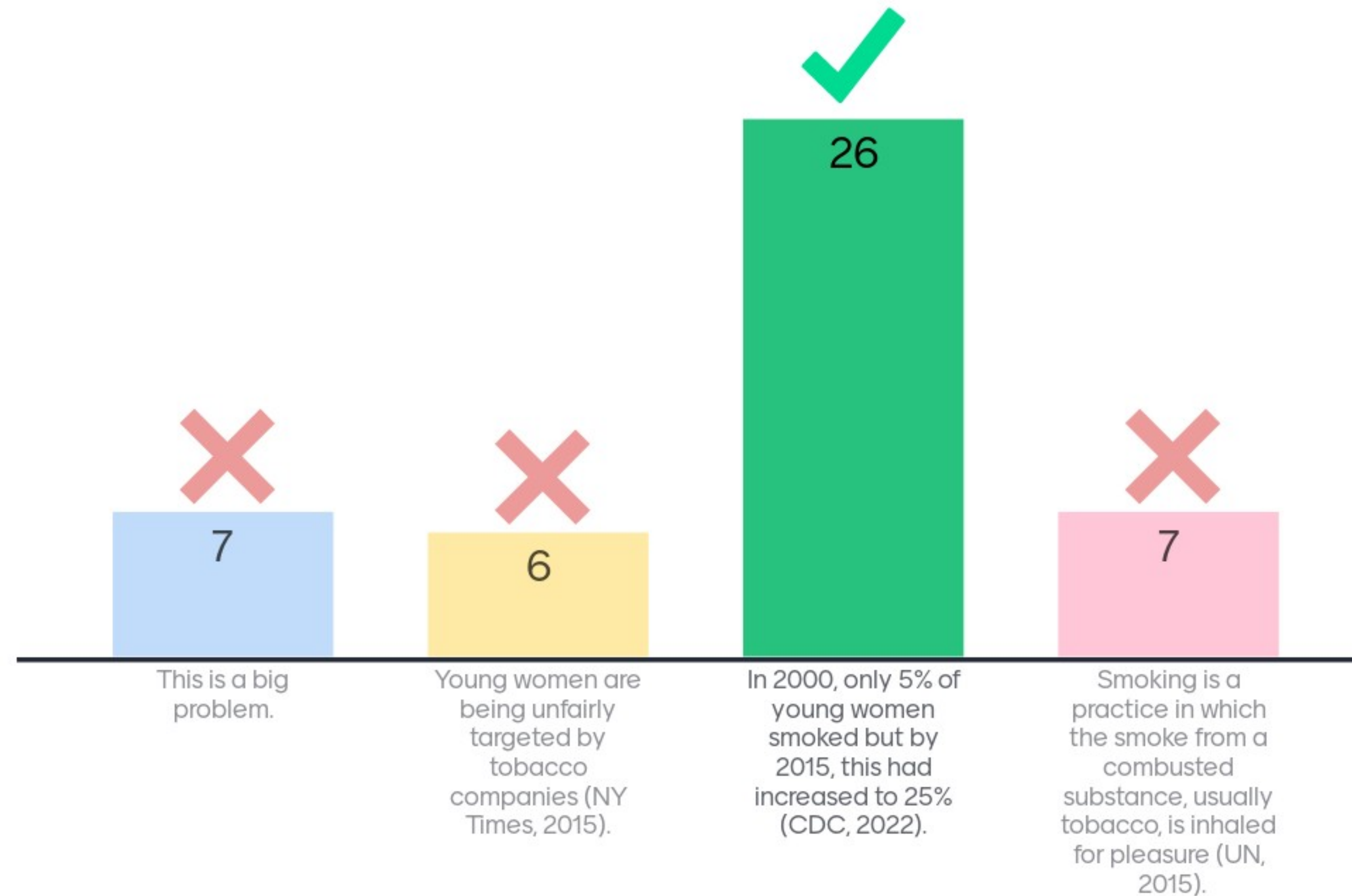

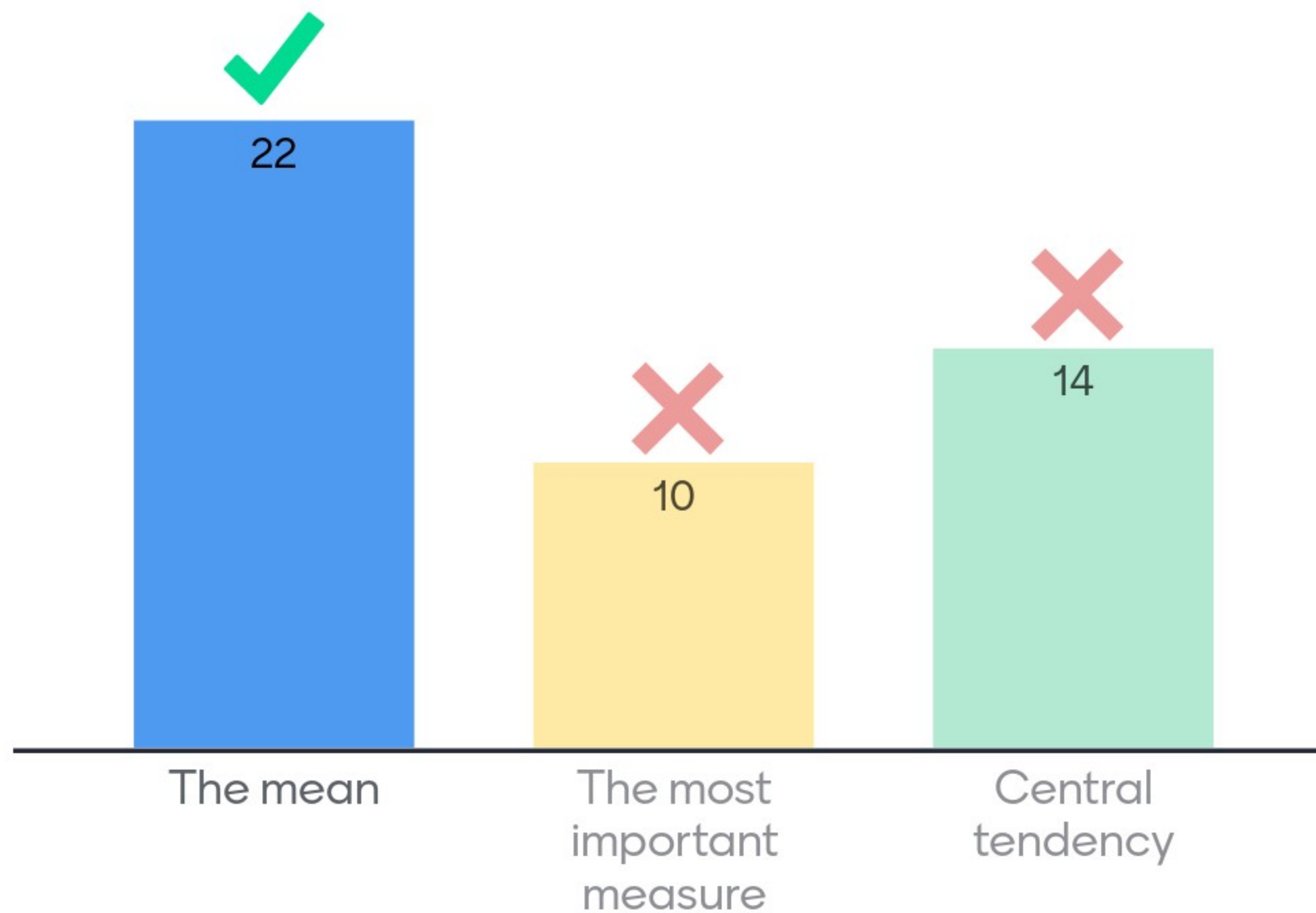

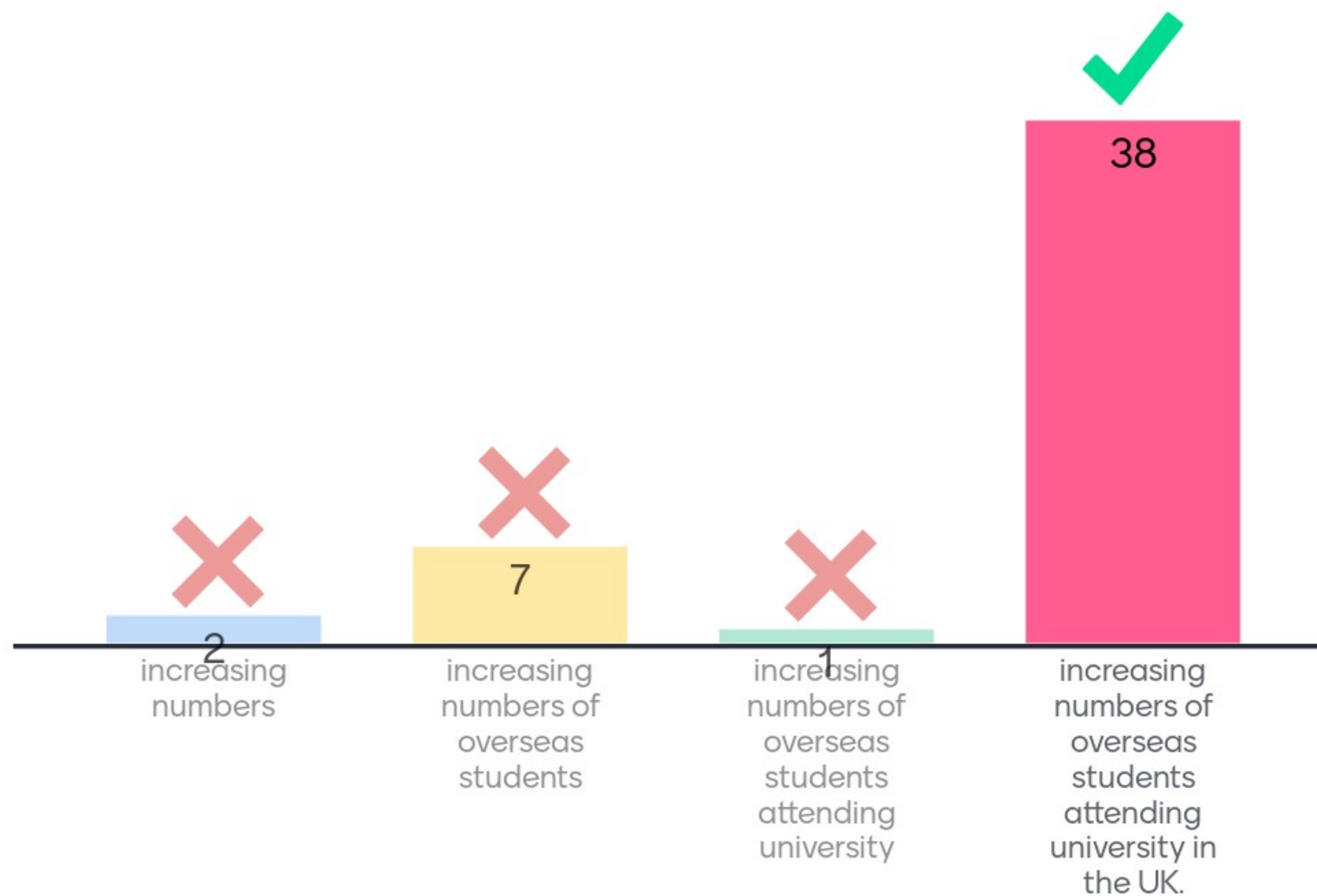

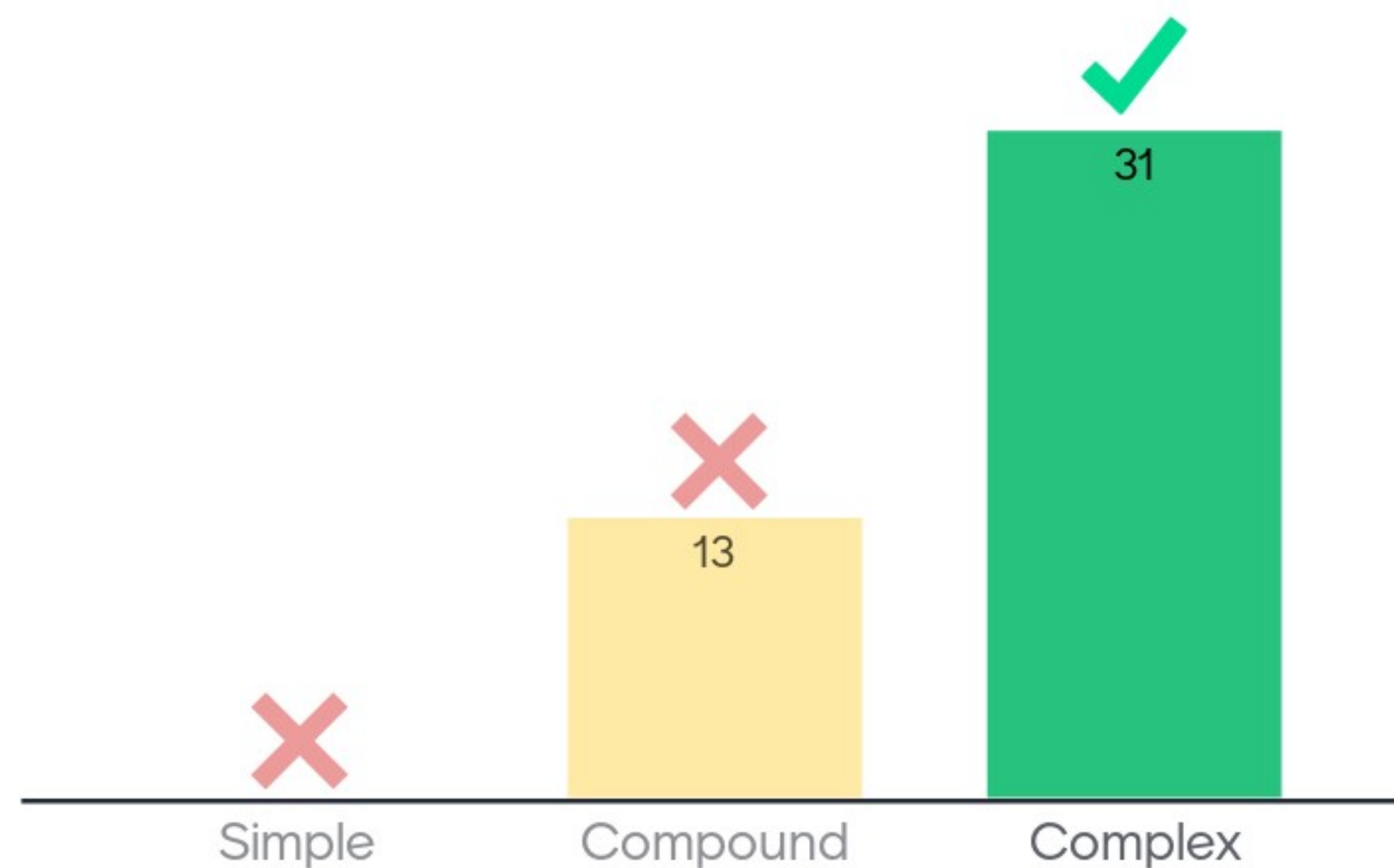
The vertical scale starts at 0 in the second graph, and the length of the bars is proportional to the actual hour of TV watching.



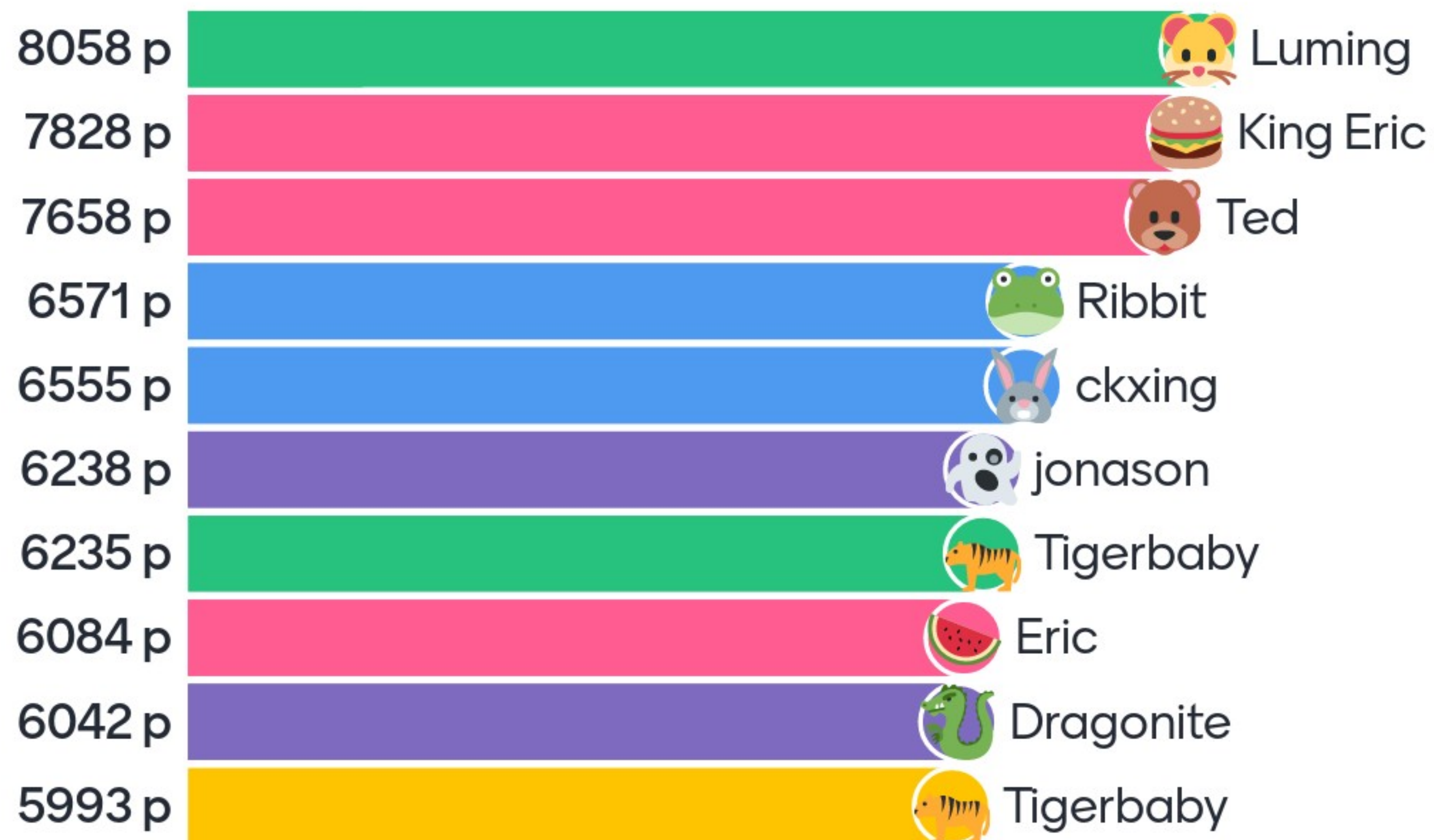
One source of deceptive statistics results from the faulty collection of data.

Discuss: simple or complex?

The data below are scores obtained by 12 students on a math quiz out of 40 marks.

Simple or Complex?

The data below are scores [that / which were] obtained by 12 students on a math quiz out of 40 marks.

'obtained by [...]' is a non-finite reduced relative clause modifying 'scores'. It is '**reduced**' because 'that were' or 'which were' have been removed and the relative clause is therefore 'reduced'.

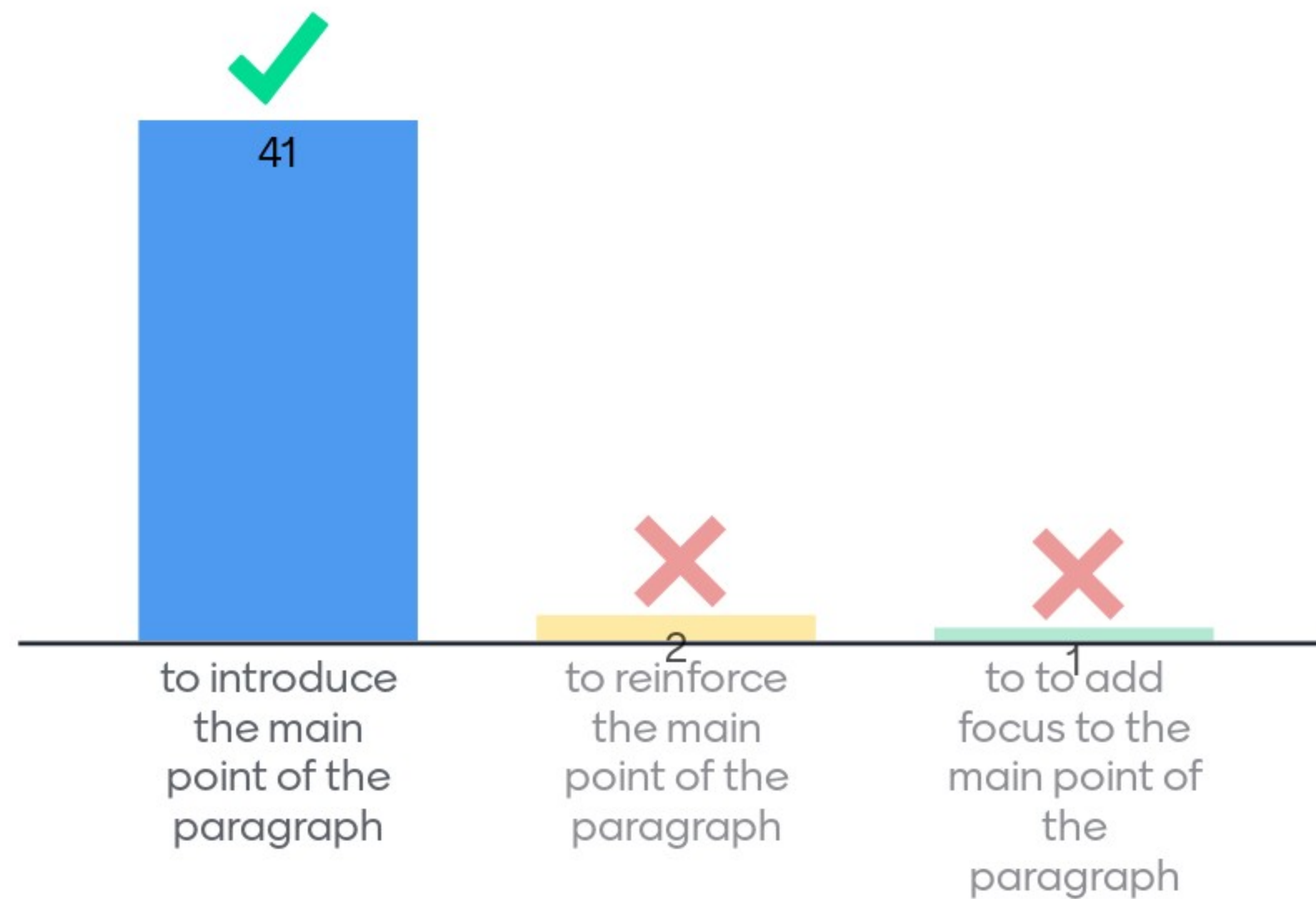
Some people would call this a simple sentence (and classify 'obtained' as an adjective), whereas other people would call it as a complex sentence because there are two clauses.
